About us

Our network was established by two mothers who noticed an opportunity to enhance the great work of the community services industry in supporting vulnerable families by being able to provide material goods to those families. From this desire to make a difference, combined with a passion for sustainability, Dandelion was born.

The Dandelion Support Network is run by volunteers, who accept, sort, and safety check pre-loved nursery equipment and children's clothes for distribution through local hospitals and support agencies. We receive no recurrent funding for the services we provide.

Once donated, the items are given a new lease on life. All the goods are processed by volunteers who follow strict quality assurance standards so that they can be enjoyed by their new owner. Once the items are ready for their new home they are packed up with love ready for a new family.

President's Report 2014/15

Since the inception of Dandelion in late 2011, we have continued to grow each year, helping more families in need in our community. This past year has been no exception with 823 families being helped in 2014/15 - nearly 250 more families than we assisted last year. Our team are constantly having to adapt to keep up with this ongoing demand.

With our continual growth, this past year has seen us focus on ensuring Dandelion is sustainable long term. We embarked on sourcing funding for a number of key positions in the organisation and thanks to the Big Sister Foundation were successful with funding for a General Manager part-time for 2015, and thanks to funding through The Funding Network and the AMP Foundation we were able to fund a Warehouse Manager part-time for a year. These two positions have been a great support to our volunteers and have helped us further refine our operational efficiencies that are critical to meeting the demands for our support services.

We were again fortunate to be successful in a number of grants this past financial year. The ClubGRANTS program has again been of great assistance to us in allowing us to purchase new cots, prams and car seats to help reduce our long waitlists for these larger items. Thank you to Bankstown Sports Club, Brighton Le Sands RSL Club, Club Central Hurstville, Parramatta Leagues Club and the Tradies for their support through the ClubGRANTS scheme. A big thank you to Streetsmart Australia for their assistance

with our cot and later our car seat crowdfunding campaigns along with the Cafesmart grant we received from them to assist families at risk of homelessness. A thank you also to Rockdale City Council who kindly awarded us a small grant which allowed us to purchase baby monitors which have been welcomed by families with premature babies and babies at risk of SIDS.

As always we are thankful for community support. Without our generous donors who bring items to our Donation Days we would not exist. This past year we were grateful for the work that went into the Inner West donation day both prior to the actual day and on the day itself, as well as the commitment from North Sydney Boys High at the North Sydney donation day.

Thank you also to the numerous corporate, community and church groups who joined us this year for working bees and volunteering days. Special mention to the team at NOVA Employment for their partnership and to the Tradies team who come regularly and volunteer their time helping at donation days and in processing stock. All of these contributions have helped enormously with processing the large amounts

of stock we receive and in turn means we are able to assist more families.

Since I spend large amounts of time at Dandelion, my children often accompany me. It is lovely to see them experiencing giving first hand and understanding the importance of helping those less fortunate than themselves. I was therefore pleased to have Woolooware High School join us this year for a volunteer day as it was not only lovely to have extra help but also it was great for the students to experience volunteering and see how some families are really doing it tough.

We are fortunate that community support extends beyond our donation days and I would like to say a special thank you to

Taren Point Hotel, the Cronulla Chamber of Commerce and Platinum Preschool Prestons for their ongoing support.

We would also like to thank our generous donors who financially support us with our campaigns and with regular donations.

As with many charities, the coming year holds some large challenges for us – the most significant being finding somewhere to relocate to as our current premises are zoned for redevelopment. Along with this challenge will be maintaining the volunteer capacity to keep up with the generous donations we receive so we can assist the growing number of families in need. We welcome any offers

of assistance with either of these challenges.

Finally, I would like to thank the hard working agencies we support and the tremendous Dandelion volunteers who go above and beyond to ensure the families in need that we assist are receiving beautiful gifts so they can start a new chapter in their lives. I feel blessed to be part of such a wonderful organisation.

Highlights & Achievements

FUNDRAISING SUCCESS Going, going, gone!

For the second year, Dandelion Support Network held an online auction via Facebook to raise much needed funds. With more than 150 items up for auction and a huge show of support from the community, we were able to raise more than \$8,000 to support our work with families in need.

Flicks for Funds

This year Dandelion were lucky enough to benefit from three movie nights, one hosted by our friends at The Beauty Bank, one from Platinum Preschool Prestons as well as one run by our own volunteers. Together these movie nights raised more than \$6,000 in funds.

Balmain Care for Kids Fair May 2015

The May Fair proved to be a great day out for the family with \$1,664 in funds being raised on the day.

Crowdfunding Campaigns

Together with our crowdfunding partner, Streetsmart Australia, we ran two campaigns during the year to help us purchase items that we can never keep up with demand for. Our generous supporters in the community pulled together and helped us raise \$3,250, which Streetsmart matched with an additional \$1,000 to purchase car seats and \$4,700 to purchase cots.

Family Fun Day

Once again we are very grateful to Taren Point Hotel for hosting a Family Fun day fundraiser in March. With free face painting, a petting zoo, jumping castle and balloon animals, the day was a huge success raising \$10,000.

RECOGNITION FOR OUR TEAM

Congratulations to one of our first recipients, Jen. Jen was awarded the Student Volunteer of the Year Award for Southern Sydney, for her work with The Beauty Bank.

Dandelion Support Network received the St George Community Award 2014 acknowledging our work in the community.

GENEROUS DONATIONS THAT KEEP ON GIVING

Thank you to all those who attended our donation days. With four off-site donation days as well as eleven at our main space, the generosity of the community kept our volunteers very busy.

MANY HANDS MAKE LIGHT WORK

Throughout the year we have had help from numerous corporate, community and church groups who joined us this year for working bees and volunteering days.

One team which deserves a special mention are the NOVA

Disability Work Trainees, a partnership that makes a huge impact for Dandelion. The NOVA team regularly come and volunteer for Dandelion, processing stock and assisting us with jobs around the office whilst building up their job-ready skills. We look forward to the next group of trainees who will start in the new year.

The team at Tradies also provide a huge help to our regular volunteers with their frequent attendance.

Thanks to everyone for helping us process all the donations we receive. Together we are making a difference in the community.

BUILDING OUR TEAM

During the year we were successful in receiving funding for two key positions to enhance how we work at Dandelion Support Network.

A huge thanks to Big Sister Foundation for a grant that enabled us to employ a General Manager part-time for 2015.

In April this year we were also fortunate to be invited to take part in a joint live crowdfunding event held by The Funding Network and AMP Foundation. Our pitch resulted in us receiving funding to employ a Warehouse Manager part-time for a year.

Dandelion are always grateful for the support we receive through grants. The funds provided enable us to assist many families in the community and we wouldn't have the impact we do without this financial support.




MEETING THE NEED IN THE COMMUNITY

Despite the generous donations of pre-loved goods we receive, we always fall short on critical items to meet the needs of vulnerable families. The funds we receive from grants and other sources enable us to purchase these items and reduce the shortfall.

The following graph helps demonstrate the gap between pre-loved cots, prams and car seats we were able to process safely and the ongoing demand. Even with the generous funds from grants, sadly there were requests that we were still unable to fill.



Playing our part

The work we do at Dandelion Support Network is just one part played in helping families in need. In the past 12 months we have partnered with more than 120 community services organisations and 10 hospitals across greater Sydney to support some of the most vulnerable children and families in our community.

Our role is to provide material goods that otherwise would be unavailable to the families and children in need of support. We rely on social workers to share with us what families really need and ensure our donations find a suitable home where they truly make an impact.

Our team of volunteers are often motivated by the heartfelt stories about the lives we are touching. With stories ranging from domestic violence and abuse, severe financial disadvantage or refugees trying to make a fresh start against all odds, our

team have the utmost respect for all the teams we partner with and what they are trying to achieve. Together we are making a difference to those in need in communities across Sydney and we are proud of what we have achieved thus far and hopeful for what we can do in the future.

PARTNER TO VOLUNTEER: CHRISTINE'S STORY

Christine has been a social worker for four years. Working with children and families facing so many complex issues, Christine knows all too well that there is no magic wand to make their lives perfect.

"I work with families struggling with challenges like poverty to domestic violence, to substance addiction to homelessness. So many of these families are doing their best to overcome these difficulties but it is not easy," says Christine.

"Since partnering with Dandelion we are able to

provide families with the basic material needs. This takes huge pressure off the families which in turn, makes moving forward that little bit easier."

"I was so inspired by the change that Dandelion can make for individuals that I couldn't help but get more involved", explains Christine.


As well as working as one of many social workers that Dandelion partners with, Christine also volunteers her time at Dandelion helping on site in any way she can and takes care of maternity packs,

Our Social & Environmental Impact

One of our core values at Dandelion Support Network is sustainability. We make every effort to embody this value throughout all our operations and to be ever mindful of our social and environmental impact.

We have continued to foster our partnerships with other local groups who can make use of items, such as cots that do not pass our standards, and

reuse the materials for various building projects.

Our work with Peninsular Toys Recyclers and Thorndale Foundation continues to see our excess of unsuitable donations of toys and clothes being repurposed as well as supporting the work of these two organisations in the community.

We have also maintained our partnership with Guide Dogs Australia to pass on soft toys and mattresses which are used during training. We also recycle mattresses through Landsavers.

Dandelion Support Network also continues to go to great efforts to operate as a paperless office. This work includes custom applications for smart phones for volunteer registration, safety checks and progress as well as stocktake and inventory. We have further simplified many of our operational processes through online means throughout the year, resulting in efficiencies as well as effective use of our resources.

Landfill or new home?

The core of what we do at Dandelion is to rehome preloved items to families in need and save those items from going to landfill. This year, we provided items that add up to approximately

30,000kg

in weight. That is a huge 30 tonnes of pre-loved baby goods that may otherwise have ended up in landfill.

From donations she is able to make sure that essential baby items, safety items, dummies, nursing pads etc are all put in the bags. Fiona is a 60 year old mother of 4 and nanna of 2.

She has always enjoyed helping people and is a community visitor to people in nursing homes, which she has done for ten years. Fiona says that the other volunteers and the great atmosphere at Dandelion make it a happy and rewarding place to come to.



NICOLE HOWARD

Nicole began volunteering with Dandelion in 2013 after seeing everything that Dandelion provided to a family through another local organisation. She was touched by the difference that made to the family in very difficult circumstances and wanted to get involved. Nicole shares the administrative work with Sarah liaising with caseworkers and donors and helps with all the day to day running of the organisation.

Gabrielle joined Dandelion 3 years ago as Grants Officer after hearing Dandelion needed help writing grants. Sorting and packing can be chaotic, but she loves the sense of achievement from making up packs for families in need. Kirsty first started making up clothing packs in her home, then became the Toy and Linen Manager and now job shares the Warehouse Manager position, coordinating with other volunteers. She loves that through Dandelion, her sons will see the value of volunteer work in their community.

Sarah has been involved with Dandelion since early 2012. She has undertaken a number of roles, including sorting and safety checking donations as well as agency liaison, fundraising and overseeing the operations of the group. Her son enjoys helping out, and will often identify toys of his own that he’d like to pass on to the “Dandelion kids”. Sarah was appointed General Manager and filled this position until taking maternity leave to welcome her baby girl into the world.

Busy with her three kids, Steph makes it on site when she can and her older two kids love to help as well. Whilst currently on maternity leave, Stephanie was working full time in Administration.




