### CHAIR'S REPORT

As we wrap up for the end of 2023, I am once again beyond proud of what our small team at Dandelion have achieved.

The past few years have been challenging for the not-for-profit sector and Dandelion has been no exception. The cost of living crisis has affected both the demand on our services whilst simultaneously affecting our supporter community.

We have seen a 30% increase in demand and our incredible team of staff and volunteers have worked tirelessly to meet this demand and ensure that children and babies across Sydney have essential items to grow and thrive.

Though it has been a tough funding environment, we have forged strong partnerships and continue to be generously supported by our network. This ongoing generosity is critical to our ongoing operations and we are grateful for the continued support to create positive changes for families in need.

Our biggest challenge remains premises to operate out of. We have been in search of premises to purchase for more than 12 months now and the lack of suitable properties has placed increased financial pressure due to ongoing rental costs. The Board remain focused on strategies for the future to mitigate this pressure and are optimistic that an opportunity will present itself in the coming months.

I would like to share my heartfelt thanks to my colleagues on the Board and to all our staff and volunteers who contribute to this wonderful organisation.

### WHAT WE DO



Our team accept donations of good quality preloved and new nursery furniture and items for babies and children. These items are carefully processed and then passed on to families in need.

Importantly, the work undertaken by Dandelion fills a service gap in the community service industry and is built on a partnership model, working alongside social workers and case managers to support families across greater Sydney and some parts of regional NSW.

### DRIVING DONATIONS

At the start of May 2023 Dandelion launched a donation delivery and pick up service. Social workers can have their requested items delivered or donors can have items picked up from around the greater Sydney and Wollongong areas for a small fee.

The service was launched in response to feedback from our social welfare partners about the difficulty in travelling to Taren Point to collect items, as well as feedback from the public around having a service to pick up donations.

It has been enthusiastically welcomed by the community and our new delivery driver, Lisa, has been kept busy delivering essential items for children and babies to agencies as well as directly to the houses of the families, while also picking up donations to ensure we can meet the increasing number of requests we are seeing each year.

# AUSTRALIAN OFFICE PRODUCTS CHARITABLE FUND

Back to school is a stressful time for many families who struggle to purchase all the items needed for their children's schooling.

Dandelion has been able to assist families with 300 good quality book packs and back packs for the last two years thanks to the generosity of the Australian Office Products Charitable Fund.

Their generosity didn't end there as they also supported Dandelion with \$10,000 to help us continue to meet the needs of disadvantaged families.



### **GROWTH AND REFERRALS**

Many low socio-economic families felt the pinch during 2023 as the cost of living increased. Dandelion really noticed the rise in need with referrals increasing by over 30%. Instead of helping 60 families a week, Dandelion was regularly assisting 80-90 families a week.

With the increase in referrals, additional donations of essential items were needed, and Dandelion was lucky to be invited to take part in the inaugural Reuse and Recycle event run by the Northern Beaches Council.

The event was held at North Narrabeen Reserve at the end of January, and was well attended. Dandelion received a large number of donations, filling a 3 tonne truck, 3.5 vans and 3 volunteers vehicles, which helped ensure we had plenty of stock to kick off the year.




### DROP OFF POINTS

To help meet the increase in demand this year we also added two new drop off points, Earlwood and Hoxton Park, to our current drop offs and while we lost our lovely Castle Hill drop off point, we gained a new drop off point in Tallawong.

We now have drop off points at Earlwood, Hoxton Park, Manly, Maroubra, Tallawong, Woonona and our headquarters in Taren Point and we are hoping to expand this network to help us continue to receive donations of essential items for the safety, wellbeing and development of disadvantaged babies and children.

The increase in the volume of donations would not be possible without our tremendous community and we would like to say a massive thank you as without you we couldn't exist. It is due to the high-quality donations that we receive that we can help the number of disadvantaged families that we do.



### MEASURING OUR IMPACT

In 2022, thanks to funding from the Social Sector Transformation Fund, Dandelion engaged The Social Impact Hub to further develop our Theory of Change, our Social Outcomes framework and review and update our Social Return on Investment.

Prior to this, the SROI calculation used by Dandelion only captured our impact related to safe sleeping and the environment. The SROI calculation has now been expanded to include the value identified in other areas, including:

- Improved child safety
- · Increased family wellbeing
- More effective service for partner agencies
- More effective and engaged volunteers.

#### **Our Theory of Change**

A theory of change depicts how a program is intended to achieve meaningful, positive changes for stakeholders (outcomes)— not simply a description of what the activities and outputs are.

The theory of change was developed from a workshop in March 2022 involving Dandelion staff, board members, volunteers, partner agencies and funders. It sets out the expected short term and longer-term outcomes.

#### **Next Steps**

Work is now underway to incorporate our new measurement framework into our reporting tool. We hope to complete this in 2024 and use the revised measurements in our impact reports with support partners.

#### **Our Impact Goals**

Our vision is that all babies and children have access to nursery and personal items essential for their safety, well-being and development.

Together with our partners and supporters in the community, we are:

- · Measurably addressing childhood disadvantage
- Addressing poverty at a community level
- Creating the foundations for families to thrive into the future.



### CORPORATE VOLUNTEERING

In FY22/23 Dandelion was fortunate to have 20 different Corporate Volunteering Groups come and volunteer with us. Many of the groups have been coming and volunteering with us for several years and we are always happy to see familiar faces returning. We also had some new groups come and assist us this year and they have commented that they enjoyed the experience and will be back again in the new year!

Corporate Volunteering groups are invaluable to us as they provide extra hands to help us process the large volume of donations we receive. Groups help us with tasks such as putting up cots and bassinets to be safety checked, sorting and packing clothes, linen and toy packs, cleaning highchairs and baths, and checking games and puzzles have all their pieces.

Some groups even held donation drives at their workplaces and brought donations with them when they volunteered!

### ANZ COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANT

In 2022 Dandelion was successful with an ANZ Community Foundation grant for \$20,000. The grant supported our "Good night, sleep tight – Keeping vulnerable babies safe when they are sleeping" project.

76 families received 9 new cots, 6 new bassinets and 46 preloved cots and bassinets to allow babies and children to sleep safely. The funding also allowed us to purchase 8 newborn car seats, 3 single prams and 3 double prams and to provide 58 preloved prams and car seats so the children were traveling safely.

Toy, clothing and linen packs were also able to be completed with funding for essential items such as pjs, socks, undies, mattress protectors and batteries, ensuring babies and children had access to what they needed for their wellbeing and development.

We would like to thank the ANZ Community Foundation for their generous support and for partnering with us to give children from 76 disadvantaged families the best start to life possible.





### INVESTING IN WOMEN NSW

In May 2023, Dandelion was delighted to find we were successful with our Investing in Women NSW program application for our "Improving participation and wellbeing of disadvantaged mothers from Western and South Western Sydney" program.

We received \$50,000 to help us with meeting the need of disadvantaged families in the Western and South Western Sydney areas and it came at a great time as many families from these areas were struggling to put food on the table and keep a roof over their heads let alone worry about purchasing costly items for their babies and children.

The grant is ongoing, and we will be looking to complete it in 2024 but feedback we have already received suggests the project in nearly every case has helped to reduce the financial stress of the family and has also improved the mental health of the family.




